Open Studios Weekend 2011

Visitors to Project Workshops' very popular Summer Open Studios Weekend on 7th and 8th May 2011 enjoyed a magical two days of demonstrations and displays hosted by the Resident Artists in their spectacular studios at Quarley, near Andover.

Perfect summer weather enabled visitors to explore the beautiful complex of artists' studios at their leisure or simply relax in the tranquil Courtyard Garden. Not surprisingly, the BBQ and stalls of local fare laid out by Parsonage Farm and 'We Cook You Eat', was a major attraction, and many a sunny picnic was enjoyed; some enhanced by the selection of cask ales provided by Mobile Bar 3.

A fascinating exhibition of 'Sculpture In The Garden' curated by resident sculptor Elizabeth Hodgson provided inspiration amongst the beautiful display of plants, some flowering unusually early thanks to the glorious weather. Elegant birds by Paul Harvey and Steve Blaylock's playful steel dragonflies joined work from Project Workshops' private collection by Paul Roberts Holmes, to form a thought- provoking display.

In the studios, newcomer Tanya Dalley created a stir with 'Razzle Dazzle', a wonderfully colourful installation promoting her 'Art Encouragement Workshops' (the sign on her door reads 'Come in - I am already disturbed!').

As always, Roman Glassmakers, Mark Taylor and David Hill delighted young and old with both their breathtaking display of glassblowing techniques and their scholarly knowledge of the traditions of glassmaking. This year they demonstrated techniques used to make Georgian glass including baluster goblets and air twist-stemmed glasses, assisted by visiting glassmaker Tracy Snape.

Ancient skills were also on display in the Talos Art Foundry, where bronze sculptures are still made using centuries-old techniques. This year Talos was showcasing bronzes made for Dorset Sculptor Andrew Thomas, who brings his beautifully crafted wood carvings to the foundry to be cast in bronze. Next door, Vivien Mallock was displaying a selection of her recent bronzes including her latest life-sized figure "The Secret", made to commission for a private collection. Vivi had invited local furniture makers Terry Lynch and Harry Gibb to join her in her studio for the weekend, and their rustic, workaday tables and stands created a strong backdrop for a selection of her popular smaller dancing figures and birds.

A steady stream of bags and packages was seen leaving the workshops, many containing pottery from Jennie Gilbert's Mishima range, or one of Elaine Peto's handmade ceramic animal sculptures. "It's been a great weekend" said resident artist and event organiser Amy Goodman, whose display of sculpture and elegant ink drawings drew many compliments (and a commission!) "Comments from all our visitors have been so positive and encouraging. Everyone has really enjoyed the event and so have we!"

New Resident Artist - Tanya Dalley

Tanya says: "My work is driven by curiosity. It's about materials, marks and colour, and also about the presence of a subject, and therefore the many ways of seeing life.

I offer courses that refresh those who feel overbusy and inspire the artistically timid. This can involve art practice, and sometimes play, storytelling, inquiry, meditation or foolishness.

In our chaotic world the chance to stop and think about things differently can be a fun and rewarding journey into what lies deeper. Whether you're an adult or child this approach can have an amazing impact on your artistic expression".



Talos Art Foundry - Pieta Sculpture in bronze by Gill Kaufmann

The Talos Art Foundry is currently casting a life size Pieta, which was originally modelled by sculptor Gill Kaufmann in 1956. The sculpture was commissioned to take pride of place in the crypt of the Roman Catholic cathedral of Bulawayo, Zimbabwe, and was modelled from local clay which was then fired in a nearby brickworks. The crypt was never built, however, and the sculpture lay forgotten in a church hall for thirty years before being moved to the cathedral's garden of remembrance, where it stands today.

In February 2011 the Talos Art Foundry was commissioned to send a team to Bulawayo to make a mould of the Pieta, which is now too fragile to move, and return it to the UK in readiness for a bronze cast to be made. The mould, which was made in 45 sections and took two weeks to make, arrived back at the Talos Art Foundry in April, and work began on creating a plaster copy of the sculpture ready for casting.

In June, Gill, now 83, visited Talos to add her finishing touches to the plaster and finally approved it for casting, fifty five years after first starting on the project. "It's been wonderful seeing Gill working on her Pieta," said Richard Atkinson-Willes, director of the Talos Art Foundry, "she's got an amazing eye for the figure and the surface of the sculpture that she learned at the Royal Academy School under Maurice Lambert and Charles Wheeler. It's a classic piece with a fascinating story."

Arthur Wharton Sculpture by Vivien Mallock

The Arthur Wharton Foundation have commissioned our resident artist Vivien Mallock to create a 1½ times life-size sculpture of Arthur Wharton, the first professional black football player in the world.

Wharton was an all-round sportsman - in fact, in 1886 he set a world record of ten seconds for a 100 yard sprint in the AAA championship, which remained unbeaten for thirty years. He was also a keen cyclist and cricketer, playing for local teams in Yorkshire and Lancashire.

However, he is best remembered for his exploits as a footballer, playing first for Darlington and then for Preston North End, one of the teams which reached the FA Cup semi-finals in 1886/7.

The sculpture shows Wharton playing in goal in 1886, and will be displayed in Darlington, home of his first team. The piece will be finished at the end of September, but plans are afoot for it to be displayed at Wembley for the 2012 Olympics, before being delivered to Darlington.
